

Display Stands for Your Models

To make display stands for your models, first print out these pages on plain paper. Glue the pages to stiff matte board or foam core.

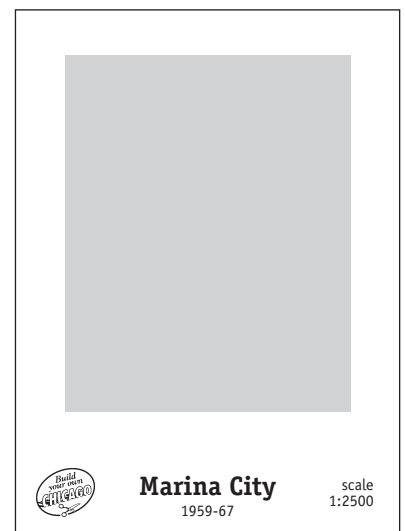
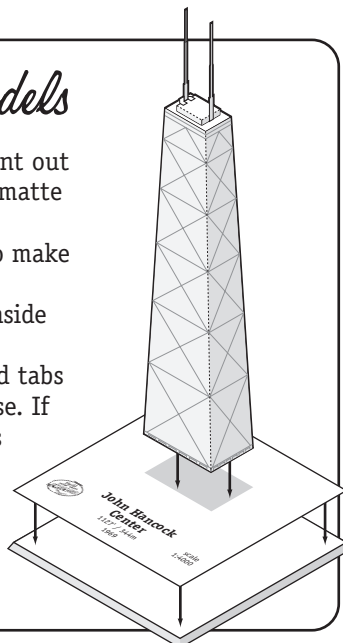
Press the pages under a heavy book overnight to make sure the glue dries flat.


Cut to the pieces to the correct size. Trim just inside the border lines for a clean display.

Glue the model to the base. You may want to add tabs to the bottom of the model to connect it to the base. If you have already built the model, you can add tabs made from folded scraps of paper under the bottom of the model to glue it to the base.





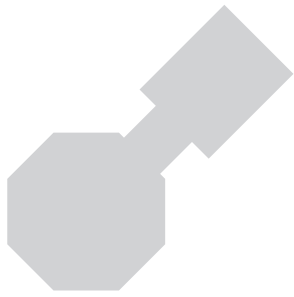

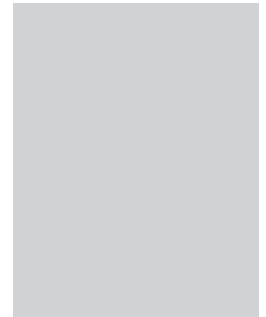
